STATISTICS Born (nee Rinell) July 10, 1928 in China. 5'6" tall. 140 pounds. Married for twenty-eight years to Bernard J. Holmquist. Parents and grandparents were missionaries to China, Japan, and Korea. Have four children, ages 27, 25, 22, and 18.

PROFESSIONAL Worked as nurses' aid trainee under a German missionary doctor for eight months in 1945-46 while in North China; was a nurses' aid in the Sahlgrenska Hospital in Gothenburg, Sweden, for one year. Became a licensed practical nurse in Minnesota in 1952 and a licensed vocational nurse in California in 1968. Worked a total of twelve years at Fridhem Home for the aged in Chicago, the Minneapolis Lutheran Home, San Fernando Hospital, and Santa Paula Memorial Hospital in California.

Registered Nurse: Worked for two years at Santa Paula Memorial Hospital in medical, surgical, emergency, and coronary care, the last year as night supervisor. Was director of Nursing Services at the Acacia Nursing Home (AARP & NRTA) in Ojai, California from September 9, 1973 until March 22, 1976. Duties were: scheduling, hiring and discharging of staff, orientation on new personnel, lecturing, coordination of fire and disaster drills, making nursing-care plans, counseling of patients and their families, counseling staff, public relations hostess for AARP & NRTA member visitors, drawing blood for laboratory studies on patients' EKG, evaluator of Medicare and Medi-Cal, speaking to church and civic groups on behalf of the Acacia's, promotion of volunteer services, advisor of first aid for Meals on Wheels and Heels, hostess for patient and staff social functions, inservice director for patient and their families, director of music therapy, involved in junior high and senior high volunteer groups, and discharge planning after patient is able to go home. Am an active Red Cross Nurse.

EDUCATION Red Cross School of Nursing in Stockholm, Sweden, for sixteen months, but had to discontinue education due to poliomyelitis. No disability.

Graduated Ventura College in 1971 with an Associate of Arts degree in nursing. Chosen nursing student of the year and also the graduating senior with the greatest clinical potential by the California Nursing Association.

ACTIVITIES String band director at my church while in Sweden. Play accordian, piano, hammond organ, and guitar. Enjoy choral work. Languages: Speak fluent English, Chinese, Swedish, and have a working knowledge of German.



Utilization Review Coordinator at skilled nursing facility. Evaluated all patients upon admission to SNF.

Each patient was evaluated as to status of care at the arrival in the facility. They were then put under one of the following care levels: covered care, non-covered care, or questionable care.

The Utilization Review Committee was held once a month and each patient was reviewed as to service needed and admission and duration of stay.

The UR Committee consisted of three doctors, the administrator, the director of nurses (myself), a secretary, the bookkeeper, the pharmacist. When needed, the recreation director, the dietitian, maintenance, and housekeeping were present.

No physician reviewed any case in which he was professionally involved.

Each case (with case number) was signed by two physicians after careful evaluation.


If a patient was covered care and disqualified before the next UR meeting, a subcommittee was done by one physician and myself.

The next of kin or legal guardian was notified by mail concerning patient status within seventy-two hours of the UR Committee decision.

Careful attention was given to state regulations and an objective evaluation was made as to qualification for Medicare or Medi-Cal.

If, upon admission, the patient obviously is "non-covered care," the patient or next of kin signed a statement of acceptance of financial responsibility for billing.
