It is either following you or as Helen thinks never sent from the hotel! I gave him postage money and he promised to post the stamps on and mail it. The money was probably pocketed! Sorry, because I wrote about the Welles* and my delightful evening with the old, China-hands in their home. You have to come to Sweden and I will tell you all about it! My second letter from Palestine, no from Sweden, was sent to Port Said. There you get Putnam's detailed plans for the Arab and Israel sides. I hope your steamer gets through OK. I think it will but you will probably have to go to Genoa. I think you do well in delaying your Atlantic passage. If you don't get to Israel there is a lot of interesting places to see in Europe. You ask about expenses in Israel. They are fairly high because one Israel pound is the equivalent of U.S. \$2.80. Actually outside of Israel it is only 190 cents or under. My 120 was enough for the week because friends at Siberias prefer food parcels to pay, i.e. from Sweden. I did a little black market business which saved a good deal!! My photos have just been sent down to Göteborg so I have not seen them. Helen and I are in Leksand for two weeks - a beautiful spot. Pearl's sister has also written about Pearl's permit. Glad she will soon be out. I am also glad that the Seuferts are leaving. Hope the Lutherans and Pop soon get out too. I possibly
