Dear Irene,

I have been informed that S/S Tamerlane is expected at Copenhagen about Dec. 13th. Unless the present timetable is changed, she is not due to call at Göteborg. Of course orders may be issued for such a change if cargo warrants it. In case your boat does not call here, it would be better to make arrangements and have your ~~bag~~ baggage transhipped in Rotterdam or Antwerp, wherever your steamer calls, and sent straight to Southampton. I think it would be a good idea to check this as soon as possible.

In my letter yesterday I asked a favour. Please buy 4 or 6 Kodak Super-XX film packs. Each ~~box~~ carton contains twelve 4X5 in. (10x12.5 cm.) Super-XX film exposures. Write down the address of the store in case I need to contact it in the future.

Our boxes are not expected to arrive before the beginning of January.

The weather in Sweden at present is not too good. I hope we will have snow around Christmas, so you can see some winter sports. After all the China fellowship is the most important. I hope you are enjoying the different cities on the continent. Take lots of photos so you have something to illustrate your world tour *of Sweden*.

Eggon left this morning from Stockholm on a SAS plane and is due in Japan this Friday. The Rinells have become air-minded!

Letters have just been received from Ida Hein and Frank Halling. Ida has rooms for guests. Frank wants someone to start an agricultural mission close to Manila. May be the Presbyterians are interested in a new project?

Sverige-Nytt, an airmail newspaper for Swedes in foreign countries, has had a long interview with me for a Christmas number. I have just read the manuscript. The editor heads it "The Lord's Imperialist." It is about us Rinells and the latest missionary situation in China.

I have just written an article about Christianity in Red China^h for a Swedish Christian daily. Our radical viewpoints are embodied in it. I am anxious to see if the Editor dares print it and if he do, what reaction it will cause. The truth must out whatever it costs.

More when we meet. Hope you will let us know when you expect to arrive - in Stockholm or Göteborg.
