Many thanks for your kind letter of Jan. 30th. It was so good to hear from you. We are very sorry to hear that Mrs. Culpepper had such a hard time, but certainly praise and thank God that she is well on the road to regaining her strength. We wish her a speedy ~~recovery~~ <sup>Pearl</sup> and complete recovery.

I am glad has been such a great help to her during her illness and suffering. Is she still in HK or on her way to the States? I received her letter but had already written her c/o her sister. It is so good to know that she, Clara "Pop" Hanson and the Ridders have gotten out of T' tao. Hope sincerely that Paul Mackensen and the Semferts soon get out.

I note that the General Baptist Conference has sent the \$350.- and that our accounts are cleared up. Outside of this account I sent Pearl JMP1,800,000 or something like it from Tientsin. I have never heard if she received it. I figured that it would cover local freight in T' tao for Misses Hedquist and Kallgren and myself. I also wrote that my teacher, Mr. Chang, should get JMP300,000 out of this sum. All I hope is that this amount outside our accounts but in connection with Pearl was enough to cover the above mentioned expenses.

I attended the dedication of the Swedish Institute for Missionary Research at Uppsala. The first week in April a mission course is to be held in our Theological Seminary in Stockholm. I have been asked to have two lectures on: "Communism and Christianity in Asia." I have attended missionary meetings in several churches.

I have been asked to write a booklet about Christianity in Communist China. If you have any suggestions, reports, articles or books or news items re this subject I would very much appreciate your sharing them with me. The rub however is that I should have the manuscript ready by May 1st. in order to have it printed this year.

Hellen is improving in health. She must still take care of her nerves. We have a very nice home. My 20 boxes have arrived. Very few books missing. My books fill two solid walls. It makes it so homey together with Chinese things. Our best wishes to Mrs. Culpepper, Pearl, yourself and all who know us.
