Dear Genda & Eggon,

Since I returned home I hear that you soon will celebrate your Silver Wedding. Well, here are now hearty congratulations! These lines may arrive somewhat late but be sure my best wishes are sincerely meant. We probably will celebrate the great occasion somewhere tomorrow.

I may call anytime at your Japanese home! Don't be surprised! While Switzerland expects to look after Chinese prisoners-of-war who refuse to return to Red China, Sweden may be called on to take charge of the armistice, if there is a cessation of arms. 100 Swedes are making preparation for the job. Among these are to be interpreters with knowledge of English and Chinese or English and Korean.

There are not many who have these qualifications. I have applied and the Board has given me a good recommendation. A Swedish captain who has been 20 years on the China-sea has headed in his name. He probably knows some Pidgin English and some Chinese cursing! In case we go we must sign for at least 6 months. I hope I get the job. Please give me Cornelius's address and some others I may call on in case - - -
